General Risk Assessment

Area Assessed: Liverpool Cathedral (for Education Department)

Date 13.3.15 **Review Date:** 13.3.16

This risk assessment is provided to assist school groups with planning their visit to Liverpool Cathedral. It is strongly recommended that the member of staff organising the trip pays an initial visit to the Cathedral in order to carry out their own risk assessment, which can include the journey to and from the Cathedral. Schools intending to take pupils to the Elizabeth Hoare Embroidery Gallery and Tower must inform parents/guardians of the risks associated with the climb and obtain permission to take pupils to these areas, (see Tower Risk Assessment and forms).

Before the tours begin a safety briefing will be given by the leader. This will include:

- 1. Expectations of behaviour Reminder of place of worship
- 2. Potential hazards to look out for
- 3. Instructions to hold the rail at all times, keep to the wider edge of the steps, remain quiet and calm.
- 4. No running
- 5. Staying as a group
- 6. Reminders of these will be given during the tour at appropriate moments.
