Things to think about

Things to do

- Visit a church or cathedral and see how many angels you can spot.
- Make an origami angel.
- Paper plate angel

You will need: a paper plate, paper doilie, plain paper, glue, scissors, felt pens and tinsel



Fold the paper plate in from the sides.

Cut the doilie in half and then half again to make the wings and stick the quarters to the back of the folded paper plate.



Cut a circle from the plain paper and draw face details on. Stick to the top of the paper plate.

Add a small ring of tinsel for a halo.
