that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

so that everyone who believes in him may not perish
but may have eternal life.

that we may share your risen life,
and proclaim your saving grace
to those around us;
now and for ever.
Amen.

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
Things to think about

- Have you ever held or touched a snake?
- How did it feel?
- Why are snakes seen as scary or evil?

Things to do

- Research different types of snakes, find out where they live and what they eat.
- Make a spiral snake from a paper plate.
- Concertina folded paper snake

You will need: coloured paper, glue, scissors, googly eyes



Cut strips from two colours of paper.



Stick two different coloured strips together at right angles.

Fold the strips over each other as shown. Glue the last folds together.

Make a snake's face and add the eyes and a tongue.



Glue the face to one end of your snake.

Use longer strips to make a longer serpent
