Things to do

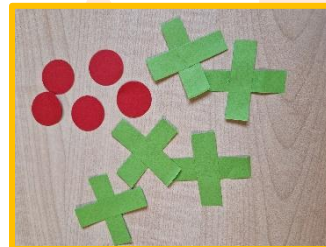
- Invent a new game to play outside.
